4. Enrollment and Admissions

Eligibility Requirements:

Residency: Students can be from anywhere in the world.

Grade Levels: DLX, partnered with Nelson Academy, serves students in grades 6 through 12.

Age Requirements: There are no age restrictions.

Academic Requirements: Students must provide prior academic records demonstrating their ability to succeed as well as assist our graduation coaches in creating a custom, learning plan and experience.

Application Process:

Application Form: Prospective students must complete an online application form available on the DLX website.

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Orientation:

Orientation Session: Accepted students must attend a on-demand orientation session to familiarize themselves with the school's platform, policies, and expectations. Parents/Guardians are recommended, but not required to attend as well.

Admission Criteria:

Academic Performance: Evaluation of previous academic performance to ensure the student is prepared for the rigors of Nelson Academy's curriculum.

Commitment to Mission and Vision:

Consideration of the student's alignment with DLX's mission to prepare for the global workforce and continuing education beyond high school.

Acceptance and Enrollment:

Notification of Acceptance: Applicants will receive an email notification regarding their acceptance status within two weeks of completing the application process.

Enrollment Packet:

Accepted students will receive an enrollment packet containing:

- Login credentials for the Learning Management System (LMS).
- Detailed instructions on how to access and navigate the LMS.
- Information on course selection and scheduling.
- Contacts for academic advisors and technical support.

Course Registration:

Students will work with a graduation coach to select appropriate courses based on their academic history, interests, and career goals.

Registration must be completed by the deadlines provided in the enrollment packet.

Withdrawal Policy:

Voluntary Withdrawal:

Students wishing to withdraw must submit a withdrawal form, available on the DLX website, signed by a parent/guardian or school partner official

Tuition refunds, if applicable, will be processed according to the school's refund policy.

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Involuntary Withdrawal:

Students may be subject to involuntary withdrawal due to failure to meet academic standards, violation of the code of conduct, or non-payment of tuition fees.

Parents/guardians will be notified in writing prior to any involuntary withdrawal.

<u>Re-Enrollment Policy:</u>

Returning Students: Students who wish to return to DLX after withdrawing must complete a re-enrollment application.

Academic Review: Returning students' academic records will be reviewed to ensure they meet current academic standards.

Updated Documentation: Returning students must submit updated proof of residency, academic records, and immunization records.

- Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses.


Electives are designed to enhance the core curriculum and allow students to explore their interests and talents as well as prepare for Certification in some cases.

Feedback Mechanisms:



Academic Integrity

7. Attendance Policy


DLX, partnered with Nelson Academy, places a high value on regular attendance and active participation as essential components of academic success in a on-demand learning environment. This attendance policy outlines expectations, procedures, and responsibilities to ensure that students remain engaged and accountable for their learning.

Attendance Expectations:

- **Daily Log-In:** Students are expected to log into the Learning Management System (LMS) each school day. Daily log-ins are recorded and monitored to ensure consistent attendance.
- **Class Participation:** Students must attend all scheduled live on-demand classes, webinars, and instructional sessions. Participation in discussions, group activities, and collaborative projects is required.
- Assignment Completion: Students are expected to complete and submit all assignments by their due dates. Timely submission of assignments is considered part of attendance and participation.
- Attendance Tracking: Attendance is tracked through the LMS, which records log-ins, time spent on coursework, and participation in on-demand classes. Teachers and administrators regularly review attendance data to identify patterns of absenteeism or disengagement.
- **Absence Reporting:** Parents/guardians must report student absences by notifying the school via email or phone before 9:00 AM on the day of the absence. An absence report should include the student's:
 - Name
 - Grade level
 - Reason for absence, and
 - Expected return date
- Types of Absences:
- Excused Absences- Illness or medical appointments
- Family emergencies
- Religious observances
- Approved educational activities (e.g., college visits, educational travel)
- Other reasons deemed acceptable by school administration

Documentation, such as a doctor's note or a parent/guardian letter, may be required to excuse an absence.

- Unexcused Absences:
 - Failure to log in without a valid reason





- Absence without prior notification and approval
- Vacations or trips not approved by the school administration
- Chronic Absenteeism:

Chronic absenteeism is defined as missing 10% or more of school days within a semester. Students who are chronically absent may face academic consequences and will be required to meet with their graduation coach and parents/guardians to develop an attendance improvement plan.

- Attendance Interventions:
 - *Early Intervention:* Teachers and graduation coaches will reach out to students and parents/guardians when attendance issues are first identified to provide support and resources.
 - Attendance Improvement Plan: Students with excessive absences will be required to participate in an attendance improvement plan, which may include regular check-ins, additional academic support, and goal-setting meetings.
 - Disciplinary Actions: Continued unexcused absences or failure to adhere to the attendance improvement plan may result in disciplinary actions, including academic probation or withdrawal from the school.

Responsibilities:

Student Responsibilities:

- Log into the LMS daily and attend all scheduled on-demand classes.
- Complete and submit assignments on time.
- Communicate with teachers and academic advisors regarding any difficulties with attendance or coursework.

Parent/Guardian Responsibilities:

- Ensure that their child logs into the LMS daily and attends on-demand classes.
- Report absences promptly and provide necessary documentation.
- Support their child in completing make-up work and adhering to the attendance policy.

Teacher Responsibilities:

- Record attendance accurately and regularly in the LMS.
- Provide make-up work and support to students who have missed classes.
- Communicate with students and parents/guardians regarding attendance issues and interventions.




Administrator Responsibilities:

8. Code of Conduct

 - Parents/guardians should maintain open communication with teachers and school staff.



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
- Reporting any issues or concerns promptly is essential to address potential problems early.

• Prohibited Conduct:

- Academic Dishonesty: Cheating, plagiarism, and any other forms of academic dishonesty will result in disciplinary action.

- Long-term suspension or expulsion from Nelson Academy
- Involvement of law enforcement if necessary
- **Behavior Improvement Plan:** Development and Implementation: A behavior improvement plan may be developed for students with repeated violations. The plan will include specific goals, actions, and timelines to address the behavior.

- Appeals Process:
 - Right to Appeal:

- Our special education team works closely with students, parents/guardians, and teachers to ensure that appropriate accommodations and supports are in place.


Career and College Readiness



The portal includes tools for direct communication with teachers and academic advisors, facilitating timely and efficient exchanges of information.





Workshops and Training

Supporting Online Learning:

DLX, partnered with Nelson Academy, offers workshops to help parents and guardians support their child's online learning experience. Topics include: creating an effective home learning environment, understanding the LMS, and helping students stay organized and motivated.

Digital Safety and Citizenship:

Training sessions on digital safety and citizenship educate parents and guardians on best practices for online security and responsible technology use. These sessions cover issues such as cyberbullying, internet safety, and managing screen time.

College and Career Readiness:

Workshops focused on college and career readiness provide parents and guardians with the knowledge to support their child's future planning. Topics include navigating the college application process, understanding financial aid, and exploring career options.

Work-Based Learning & Community Involvement

Community Involvement

Students can earn up to .5 credits for Community Service for 90 approved hours by their school counselor & graduation coach..

Work-Based Learning

Students may earn up to 1 credit in Work-Based Learning in conjunction with the support course of Soft Employability Skills plus 90 hours of work experience.

On-Demand Work Internship may also be available for credit based on the current needs of work partners.

Support and Resources

Academic Support Services:

Academic support services, including tutoring and study skills workshops, are available to help students succeed.

Parents and guardians are encouraged to utilize these services to support their child's academic progress.

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Special Education Services

DLX, partnered with Nelson Academy, provides special education services for students with IEPs or 504 Plans. Parents and guardians are integral partners in developing and implementing these plans to ensure their child's success.

Engagement and Feedback

Surveys and Feedback Forms:

Regular surveys and feedback forms allow parents and guardians to share their experiences, suggestions, and concerns. This feedback is used to continually improve school programs and services.

Focus Groups:

12. Communication Guidelines

 - Avoid sharing personal information or private details without permission.

Communication Channels

Cyber Safety and Digital Well-being

Digital Citizenship:


Social and Leadership Clubs

15. Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

How do I earn a US diploma?

Student must complete a total of 20 US credits (minimum of 5 credits earned from Nelson Academy).

Example Credit List:

- 1 CTE or Work Based Learning Credit
- 4 English Credits
- 2 Math Credits
- 2 Science Credits
- 1 US Government
- 1 Economics or Personal Finance
- 1 Fine Arts or Visual Arts or Technical Arts
- 1 Health & Physical Education

The balance of credits can be in any course. The school transcript will be evaluated, and a dual graduation plan will be created by the graduation coach.

How do I access my courses?

Log in to the LMS with your provided credentials.

What if I have technical issues?

Contact the technical support team via the LMS helpdesk.

How do I submit assignments?

Assignments should be submitted through the LMS. Detailed instructions for submission are provided within each course.

What resources are available if I need help with a class?

Tutors and academic advisors are available to assist with coursework. Additionally, students can access online resources, such as instructional videos and practice exercises, through the LMS.



How do I communicate with my teachers?

Use the LMS messaging system or school email to contact teachers. Teachers typically respond within 24-48 hours.

What should I do if I am struggling with the coursework?

Reach out to your teacher for guidance, and communicate with your graduation coach to develop a plan for success or your local school counselor.

Are there any group projects or collaborative assignments?

Yes, some courses include group projects and collaborative assignments to promote teamwork and communication skills. Instructions and guidelines for these projects are provided within the course.

How is my progress monitored?

Progress is monitored through regular assessments, quizzes, assignments, and participation in on-demand classes. Parents/guardians can also track progress through the parent portal in the LMS.

What if I need to retake a course?

DLX, partnered with Nelson Academy, offers credit recovery options. These self-paced courses allow students to focus on areas where they need improvement and stay on track for graduation as well as options for Course by Exam for full academic credit.

How do I request transcripts or other academic records?

Requests for transcripts and other academic records can be made online. Detailed instructions for requesting records are provided on the school's website.

What are the requirements for graduation?

Students must complete the required number of credits in core subjects and electives, meet the set standards, and pass any required exams to graduate. Detailed graduation requirements are outlined in the Academic Policies section of this handbook.

How do I stay informed about school events and updates?

Important updates and announcements are posted on the LMS dashboard. Additionally, the school sends out regular newsletters and emails to keep students and parents/guardians informed.



Can I participate in sports?

While traditional sports are not available, on-demand sports, clubs and fitness programs are offered.
